#### 3 **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

Any member of the parish may speak for up to 5 minutes on any matter on the Agenda with the session lasting no more than 20 minutes

A member of the public attended to speak in respect of opposition to item 10.2, 25 Garden Flats Lane.

The Parish Council brought forward item 10.2 for discussion

10.2 25 Garden Flats Lane Dunnington York YO19 5NB - Variation of conditions 3 and 5 of permitted application 13/01960/OUT to amend location of proposed garage and increase height of proposed dwelling – Cllr J Brooks stated objections have been put forward and it has been 'called in' which means it should go to the committee. Committee will now only meet after the elections and the discussion will only be on the variations

#### 4 SCOUT AND GUIDE HUT

Cllr L Black has liaised with the probation service who are to carry out the decorating of the Scout Hut and tend to the garden, they will start the work in about a month. She will keep in contact and advise the outcome.

Peter Wilson has agreed to take a look at the hut from a Health and Safety perspective, carrying out the PAT testing and tests on the radiators.

Cllr D Martin wanted to clarify the issue of who owns the Scout Hut – the Parish council own the hut and have the right to sell provided any revenue would go back into a related purpose in the village.

#### 5 UPDATE ON PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Thirteen people nominated therefore the Council will have no vacancies when the New Council meets in May.

The Vice Chairman Cllr J Brooks was asked to clarify the position regarding Ward elections. Dunnington is now part of the Osbaldwick and Derwent Ward and two Councilors will be elected. The merger is due to Dunnington not being big enough to be a ward in its own right.

### 6 LOCAL AND NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS

- 6.1 Update on the Local Plan Cllr J Brooks reported that the Local Plan is now in abeyance and there is only basic work taking place now until after the election
- 6.2 Update on the DPC Neighbourhood Plan Cllr D Martin Cllr Martin reported:

That a very positive meeting had been held with Steve Wragg from CYC flood control in including a tour of the village. He explained the extensive surface water run of measures adopted on the new development at 97 York Street that resulted from Parish Council lobbying.

That the Parish Council has already decided as a priority to allocate resources including 106 and CIL money to progressing these matters and this was again confirmed by the PC.

That all the above are part of our ongoing work to finalise our largely complete Neighbourhood Plan.

That flooding was a complex situation and what was needed was a co-ordinated plan across all the involved agencies to sketch out the best ways to progress matters further, and we had requested an early follow up meeting.

That any plan had to be a team effort between the Parish Council, our residents, local farmers, the CYC flooding department, other key CYC departments and the outside agencies like Yorkshire Water, the Environment Agency, the Drainage Board. Crucially it would also be necessary to seek early engagement with those developers who have already approached us to undertake significant developments on land currently allocated under the draft Local Plan.

The meeting agreed to fund a high quality leaflet explaining to all parishioners the village's surface water issues, to be circulated as soon as possible after the General Election.

After the meeting SteveWragg had been sent:

- 1. Two photos of flooding in the lower parts of Dunnington taken after the worst effects of the storm of 2011 had subsided and typical of the effects in other parts of the village plus some photos dating back to 1977..
- 2. The text of a proposed high quality leaflet the Parish Council is keen to circulate at the earliest possible date to every household in Dunnington.
- 3. Dunnington's analysis of our flooding issues and parameters.
- 4. A context and strategy for tackling the surface water issues. (These documents were also circulated in hard copy to all present at the PC meeting and Cllr Martin requested prompt feedback on them please).
- 6.3 Housing allocation Neighbourhood Plan Cllr A Brooks
  Cllr A Brooks commented that the Housing Allocation is determined by the Local
  Plan and a discussion paper in regard to Dunnington had been written regarding the
  proposed sites.

Discussion took place re the Tractors previously discussed that are passing through the village. Nothing has been done yet but Cllr N Ford said he would speak to the Farm involved and a letter will be forthcoming from the Chairman in due course.

7.3 Report Finance and Strategy group – Cllr A Brooks reported that a meeting had taken place and that the precept and Neighbourhood Plan were discussed. The next meeting will take place after the new council has met in May.

### 8 <u>REVIEWS</u>

- 8.1 Local projects Cllr J Brooks Nothing to Report but Cllr D Martin reported that the Village Cross is listed so no work can be done unless it is approved by English Heritage.
- 8.2 PFA Update Cllr J Farmer reported that it has been a successful year for the Playing Field Sporting Sections and the Sports Club. Squash and Football have done well in their leagues and the Tennis section have a new coach for both junior and senior training. Even the Bowls section numbers have increased. Cricket had a lunch in the club to kick start their season which is looking promising with a lot of good young players coming through.

The accounts for the PFA and Sports Club are currently being audited but £12k of the loan has been repayed this year and it should be completed in 2015/16. The refurbishments are completed and it looks good.

In the new financial year the PFA are looking to renew the CCTV cameras and increase their numbers and they are reviewing the fire precautions and exits. Unfortunately the treasurer and secretary are not able to continue although the latter will stay until replaced. It would be nice to have a consistency of officers for a few years.

- 8.3 Web site Cllr C Grant Nothing to Report
- 8.4 In-Bloom Cllr R Freer Spring judging day took place the previous Thursday and all went well. The previous Saturday a concert took place in the Village Hall and £500 was raised.

A table top sale will take place on the 25<sup>th</sup> April sponsored by Costcutter.

Cllr Freer requested that something should be done regarding the dog fouling at the Nature Reserve and asked for any advice from the Council.

Council decided to look at Enforcement issues and Cllr J Brooks will find out about any available leaflets.

Summer judging will be o 16th July 2015

Cllr J Brooks passed on that the In Bloom team were doing very well.
