9.3 Report Finance and Strategy group – Cllr A Brooks reported that the group had not met

10 REVIEWS

- 10.1 Local projects as follows
 - Hassacarr Cllr A Dykes is arranging a meeting between all the interested parties. Some remedial work has been carried out by a third party.
 - Allotment fencing has not yet been completed but progress should be made in the next month
 - Street lighting some new posts have gone up in the village without any prior notice from COYC, the PC has told COYC it wishes to be involved in any new street lighting in the conservation area.
 - Telephone Box The Clerk is to enquire with YLCA in respect of the use of Ebay
- 10.2 PFA Update Cllr J Farmer sent a report AGM Thursday 19th July. Now have enough Trustees. Possible leaflet drop to emphasise the importance of PFA to the village to retain the facilities.
- 10.3 Web site Cllr A Dykes reported the website had 300 visits in the month which were broadly the same 4 pages as in other months. The website group have met and a thorough review has been carried out.
- 10.4 In-Bloom Cllr R Freer reported a £50 donation. Allotments some have been sprayed to enable them to be cleared. A small plough is to be borrowed to get rid of all the overgrown rubbish. The fencing is not finished yet but this is an ongoing process.

Cllr L Turnbull reported that the bench at the top end of Common Road is to be replaced by In Bloom. The issue of grass verges has been raised at the In Bloom meeting.

The Chairman commented on how the village is looking good and gave thanks to those watering the barrels.

- 10.5 Environment Cllr L Turnbull reported that the group have not met. The red oak in Millennium Garden closest to Intake lane will be removed and replaced.
 - There seems to be some damage to one of the trees from the grass cutting. Noted that the grass along the pedestrian park on Common Road needs to be cut back. Environment group will meet at the end of August.
- 10.6 Cemetery Cllr J Harrison was not present but the PC discussed the issue of cover when the Cemetery manager is away. The Clerk will address this issue with Cllr Harrison.
- 10.7 Playpark Cllr J Maggs reported that an incident occurred with some youths, the police attended and CCTV has been requested. New bolts are being put in with professional guidance. A committee has now been formed and there is a Chairman and Secretary in place. Volunteers are helping with the litter.
- 10.8 Transport Cllr J Maggs reported that black boxes appeared in Common Road then disappeared. Still a problem with foliage. A discussion took place in respect of large vehicles still cutting through the village.
- 10.9 Ward Committee Cllr J Brooks reported that the parking issue on York Street is still ongoing. This needs to be concluded as there are other projects that the grants can be used for. The Defibrillator was discussed as the Chairman had received an email to say it had been used but on checking this was not the case.
- 10.10 This Is Dunnington Cllr A Dykes reported that the Business Association have met and discussed working with the PC. The PC welcomed this and asked them to come and speak to us.
- 10.11 Scouts and Guides Cllr A Dykes reported that the asbestos had been dealt with but there was still a few small issues to sort out. AGM held the previous week. The Risk assessment is outstanding but Cllr A Dykes will carry this out with some help from a Parishioner.
