4 YLCA REPORT

S Kay went to the meeting. All the parishes of York have rejoined.

In a discussion on finance some of the parishes had been asked what the S106 money had been spent on as the rules are very specific.

It was felt that the police reporting was not good enough. It was agreed that YCLA will write to Julia Mulligan with a copy to the Chief Constable. Some Parishes are getting information but it's unofficial.

5 BUS SERVICE REVIEW

A further report will go to the Executive on 30th June so no news yet.

50% of the objections relate to the number 10 and 20 and many have come from Stamford Bridge which is in East Yorkshire. Since it is not certain that the service will be lost, wait and see what the report has to say.

6 LOCAL AND NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS

6.1 Cllr Jenny Brooks said that the proposals will be published on 22nd June and the working group will meet on 27th June. The long document will be available on a memory stick but every parish needs a hard copy too.

6.2 Cllr Kay said he has booked a room for the afternoon of 11th July to give information to residents. This can then be considered in the PC meeting that evening. He will put a notice on the notice board and in the Grapevine. Cllr Kay pointed out that we don't know yet how much development will be proposed. When we have the information we can decide what action to take consider our response carefully.

There has been no real progress on the neighbourhood plan and we need some help to progress it. Margaret Martin has agreed to help.

6.3 Housing. Cllr A. Brooks pointed out that we need to know what is in the local plan first. YLCA will have a meeting with Martin Grainger of COYC in July.

8 REVIEWS

8.1 Local Projects.

1. The ward committee agreed to pay for the bowser which arrived on 13 June. The ward committee was thanked.

An application has gone to the ward committee for a defibrillator but we have no news yet.
Cllr Kay went to a meeting at the school to discuss a multi-use area for games. They would like to build a hard surface area suitable for games such as netball. It would also be available for use by groups in the village for organised activities. The use of lighting was discussed but it was felt it might disturb local residents. A time limit of next summer has been set for raising finance obtaining quotes and getting planning permission.

The meeting agreed that we could give a grant of £5000 as we have not contributed to the school for some time.

4. The meeting discussed ideas for the land opposite Gimme where lorries have been turning and breaking up the verges. Suggestions included chicanes to narrow the road, or shrubs. The management of Gimme is very supportive of attempts to stop lorries damaging this area.

5. Derwent Allotments. Cllr Kay said non-green rubbish had in the past been disposed of on the allotments. Attempts have been made to improve the situation by ploughing the field and putting up gates. The meeting approved the purchase of a compost bin (about £200) and Trevor Foreman will monitor the situation.

The shed used for tools requires new windows; the meeting agreed to get quotes.

It was agreed to close off the gate from Derwent Court to discourage dog walkers and Cllr G Kay has offered to fix the fence at the front of the allotments. These were agreed.

8.2 PFA. All is going well and next step is to discuss funding of CCTV to cover the playing field and play area.

8.3 Website

It was agreed we need to move on with the recommended provider. We need to provide our requirements and they can respond in a couple of weeks. We need to get new email addresses for the Councillors so personal ones are not used for Parish Council business. We need to communicate to the village when we have the new website via the Grapevine and maybe a flyer. It was agreed to pay Julie Bone for any additional work required.

8.4 In Bloom

Cllr Freer:

- 1. the bowser has arrived; it's a big improvement.
- 2. In Bloom had held a successful coffee morning
- 3. They are looking into replacing the compost in the tubs, there are issues with chickweed and the rain
- 4. Some barrels could do with replacing but Theakstons can no longer help as they have moved to flat packs from barrels.

8.5 ENVIRONMENT

- 1. The tree report is being updated
- 2. Urban Buzz is going to fund the wildflower planting in the Millennium Garden
- 3. The PC is funding wildflower planting in the cemetery
- 4. Hassacar had some vandalism the small noticeboard was thrown into the pond. The large new noticeboard is in place with lots of information. Terry is still working on the land ownership issue.
- 5. Hagg Wood group is working with Urban Buzz and have made lots of log piles.

8.6 Cemetery

1. There was a discussion about the need to upgrade/replace the entrance and exit signs. Overall it's very well kept.

8.7 Playpark

- 1. Cllr Maggs has signed the orders for the Typhoon repairs and the safety chains on the basket swing.
- 2. The Police and PCSOs have made a robust response to a disgusting graffiti incident, visiting houses in Dunnington and Tang Hall.
- 3. The police team in York will be mounting a pro-active visit programme during the school summer holidays.

8.8 TRANSPORT

- 1. There was a discussion about the obscuring of signs around Dunnington by overgrown foliage.
- 2. Cllr Maggs is working on some dates in July to meet COYC to discuss traffic issues.
